



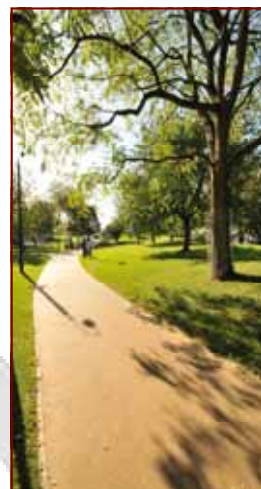

SureSet Completes Pathways at Frank Banfield Park

For some time the condition of Frank Banfield Park in West London has caused concern to the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham. However, a planned adjacent development by the property group Goodman has provided the means for the park to be upgraded as part of a Section 106 Agreement. As the Park is the 'front door' to the intended project it was important that any scheme should reflect the quality expected in the proposed development.



Planning for the Hammersmith Park was agreed in 2003 between the local council and developer. Consultation with the Hammersmith Embankment Residents Association resulted in the completion of the park which cumulated with a Grand opening on October 9th with Mayor Andrew Johnson cutting the ribbon.



The park has undergone a massive facelift over the past nine months and now boasts a brand new children's play area, gates, new benches and railings and a newly installed SureSet pathway. SureSet were contacted by Frosts Landscapes in late 2007 to provide them with a quotation for the supply and installation of SureSet Resin Bound Paving for the pathways throughout the park. The Park is named after the late Frank Banfield who was the former Mayor of the Borough.



After several months of correspondence, work started on the footpaths in June of this year. After 5 days of hard work 1183m² of pathways were completed using 3mm Sahara Gold, from our Natural Gravel range.

The area is now enjoyed by local residents, children and workers from the surrounding offices. All can now spend their time surrounded by the beautiful landscaping.

New Legislation October 2008

As of October 1st 2008 new legislation came into force and will apply to any driveway projects in England. Similar legislation will be issued in Wales, while Scotland and Northern Ireland have their own guidelines.

All paving and surfacing completed to front gardens, whether it's a brand new driveway or replacement of an existing surface will be subject to the new legislation.
